Wound Care Team Services 2021

Our Outpatient Clinic, as well as inpatient service, is directed towards the state of the art treatments of acute and chronic wounds.


Through a standardized multidisciplinary team model, the wound care team present simultaneously; the wound care clinic offers patients with all types of wounds optimal clinical care & treatment plans and prophylaxis dressings to be produced at the patient's initial visit.

The wound care team is focusing on advanced evidenced-based wound care strategies, quality assurance, and education of health care personnel.

Patients with minor problem wounds are normally seen only once, whereas patients with more

Complicated wounds continue to be treated in the inpatient departments or eventually, might be referred to the outpatient clinic. A follow-up program has been established, and the general treatment plans Algorithms for the management of patients with pressure ulcers are reviewed and followed up in the inpatients and outpatient function, with the principal strategy of relieving pressure and improving the patient's condition.

Wound Care Team Strategies In Wound Identification And Healings

Pressure ulcer prevention, management and Wound healing education are provided by the wound care team for wound care link nurses as well all nurses. This has been achieved through internal and external courses and educational arrangements.

Pressure ulcer, diabetic foot and many other wounds' care strategies and management is being delivered through continues education, follow up and referrals of the admitted cases, as well focusing on the community education for the direct caregivers of our patients, aiming to prevent and reduce the incidents of pressure ulcer, and eliminating the diabetic foot complications.

Monthly tracking and statistical review for the wounds healing "mainly hospital acquired pressure ulcer stage II and III" had been established since 2 years and achieving the target rate, with the cooperation of the team through a regular follow up of the cases, and continuous training and education of the first line nurses.

Pressure Ulcer Incidence Study Day In The Hospital On August 21-22 And 28-29, 2020 Respectively

Prevalence study is a cross sectional count of the number of cases at specific point in time, or the number of individuals with pressure ulcers, who exist in a patient population at

a point in time, also called snap- shop or point prevalence

Pressure Ulcer resources classification

- Community Acquired Pressure Ulcer CAPU
- Hospital Acquired Pressure Ulcer HAPU
- Unit Acquired Pressure Ulcer UAPU

This study was conducted to assess pressure ulcer prevalence, Incidence, clinical features, nursing care measures, and patient variables and outcomes among inpatients admitted to inpatients' departments at the university hospital Sharjah on the year of 2020.

The Pressure Ulcer Prevalence and Incidence Study were conducted last August 21-22 and 28-29, 2020 respectively.

The success of the said activities will not be possible without the utmost help of our dear senior nursing team, wound care link nurse and Selected individuals who voluntarily extended their time and effort. Hours, and have a PU indicator monitoring form included in their records. All patients with current and developing PUs were followed with this form.

How is Prevalence

Estimated/Calculated? Prevalence is the number of people in the sample (Study) with the characteristic of interest (PU), divided by the total number of people in the sample. (Study).

Prevalence = # of pts with a PU at the time of the study

Total # of pts in the hospital enrolled in the study

Pressure Ulcer Incidence Study Day In The Hospital On August 21-22 And 28-29, 2020 Respectively

Problem & Purpose

- To assess the burden of disease in a population and to assess the need for health services
- Major cause of morbidity, mortality and healthcare burden globally
- Key Performance Indicator and monthly tracking.
- To examine trends in disease prevalence or severity over time here?
- Need to focus on Prevention rather than treatment
- Gives data to support the acquisition of resources
- Evaluates prevention programs
- How big is the problem? Are we getting better?

Prevalence is the number of people in the sample (Study) with the characteristic of interest (PU), divided by the total number of people in the sample. (Study)



Pressure ulcer Resource Classification

- Hospital acquired Pressure Ulcer HAPU
- Unit acquired Pressure Ulcer UAPU

Action plans had been formulated and implemented according to the study findings with the cooperation of the nursing team leaders and front line nurses





Preventing/reducing Hospital Acquired Pressure Ulcer Rates

Efforts to improve quality and re- duce cost often focus on reducing complications that patients develop during hospitalization, known as hospital-acquired conditions. Use data from a variety of sources to identify where your organization has the greatest opportunity to improve care processes in preventing HAPU/ I. Analyze characteristics of the pressure ulcer/injuries (e.g., patient diagnosis, anatomical location of wounds, clinical contributing factors as well as data collected in rounds, audits and RCAs) to identify trends in gaps in care. Form an interdisciplinary team of individuals, including leaders and front-line staff to deter mine an area of focus.

The wound care team with the cooperation of the other multiciliary team had reduced the incidents of hospital-acquired pressure ulcers by employing trust-wide prevention strategies and protocol...

Prevention of pressure ulcers/ injuries begins with an assessment of a patient's risk for pressure ulcers/ injuries "Braden score".


This assessment must be done upon admission and then at least once daily during a patient's stay and should include evaluation of the condition of the patient's skin. Minimizing the amount of pressure on bony prominences will help to reduce the possibility of breakdown of the thin overlying skin. By re-positioning and using pressure- distribution surfaces, pressure on the skin can be redistributed. This is especially critical for patients with limited mobility, as they are at high risk for developing pressure ulcer/ injury. Friction and the stress caused by shearing forces also contribute to pressure ulcer/injury development. Friction is caused when a patient slides or is dragged across a surface, causing damage to underlying tissue which can contribute to pressure ulcer/injury formation



Methodology Of Monitoring Incidents Of Pressure Ulcer

A monthly PUs monitoring form was maintained for all patients who already had PUs. The information on this form was recorded as an indicator of nursing care. This form determined nursing care interventions and ulcer characteristics. Analyze trends in data to understand where the greatest opportunity is to improve. Understand the types of patients affected by pressure ulcer/injuries and track trends by unit regarding

The anatomical location of ulcer/injuries and contributing factors. Use data collected from prevalence studies or pressure ulcer/injury rates, as well as data from root cause analysis, case review and rounds, to identify opportunities and gaps.



Lactation Department

At university Hospital Sharjah, we implement the 10 Steps to Successful Breastfeeding by WHO and UNICEF guidelines.

Here In the maternity services starting from the antenatal period the pregnant ladies receiving awareness and education about the important of breastfeeding for the first 6 month of life then introducing the solid food along with breastfeeding till 2 years and the risk/ hazards of giving the formula milk.

Emphasizing the importance of skin to skin contact immediately after birth and early initiation of breastfeeding within the first hour.

We encourage responsive feeding and council the mothers regarding the risk of using pacifiers and teats.

We ensure that the mothers and their babies well get adequate support for successful breastfeeding even after they are discharged from the hospital by giving two appointments at our lactation clinic.

UHS Comply fully with the international code of marketing of breast milk substitute, No marketing or promotion of formula, bottles or teats will be allowed at University Hospital of Sharjah.

University hospital of Sharjah has been granted the Baby-Friendly Accreditation twice in a row (2018 and 2021).
